Despite this agreement, on several occasions, the professional asked for and accepted narcotic pain medication prescribed to his supervisees and a co-worker. The professional's job performance at the two behavioral health agencies that he was terminated from demonstrated a lack of skills by the professional necessary to fulfill the jobs' requirements and presented a danger to the health safety and welfare of clients. The professional also engaged in deceit in rendering services as a behavioral health professional when he informed the Board that he was being supervised by a previous supervisor, but later admitted that statement to be inaccurate. The professional also failed to timely comply with the terms and conditions of a previous Consent Agreement and Order. The professional's clinical file regarding the licensee did not contain any documentation regarding assessment or diagnosis and only contained a total of four illegible progress notes. The professional's ability to safely and competently practice was compromised when she failed to make appropriate arrangements for continuation of care for clients, used an aggressive and offensive communication style with co-workers, violated her employment agency's and OBHL's policies and procedures by merging groups, dismissing groups early and adding client names to group rosters.
